Cool Milk

Free milk is available for all children aged under five in school, funded by the UK government.

In our school, this milk is provided by Cool Milk, the UK's leading school milk supplier.

We will register your child for their free school milk on your behalf by providing Cool Milk with your child's name and date of birth. This removes the requirement for you to complete a registration process.

If you would prefer to register your child for Cool Milk please visit www.coolmilk.com.

All information handled by the Cool Milk group is processed in accordance with the Data Protection Act 1998. All personal information is securely stored on Cool Milk's UK servers, and is never passed on to third parties without your permission.

Once your child turns five, if you would like them to continue receiving milk you must contact Cool Milk and pay a subsidised rate.

If you would prefer us **not** to register your child for free school milk please let the office know.



School Budget — Nursery and Reception Only

As you may have heard in the press recently, budgets for schools have not increased over the past couple of years. This means, with rising expenditure, that the amount of money accessible to spend on our children has fallen.

As a result, we are asking for a voluntary contribution of £5 per term (or £30 for the school year) per child. Our Golden Rules

Our playground rules (devised by the children)

- ◆ If someone is at the Friendship Stop, include them in your game.
- ◆ Stay in the right zone.
- ◆ Line up smartly.

The role of parents and carers.
